Recent years the school has been dedicated in developing multicultural arts and music programs for the community, such as Multicultural Storytime (Multicultural SA, City of Playford, City of West Torrens) and Family Phonics (City of Salisbury). Private and public performances are also available upon request.

Our artistic projects have been supported by **Multicultural SA**, **Adelaide Festival Centre, Art Gallery SA**, **Adelaide University and Nexus Arts.**

OUTREACH PROGRAM

CHINESE MUSIC WORKSHOP

Featuring the **Erhu, Pipa and Guzheng**, School of Chinese Music & Arts delivers a new series of workshops to support language, music and HASS learning. The workshops are tailored to entertain and educate younger audiences to learn about diverse cultures through the arts.

The workshops deliver **up to 150 students**, with a minimum of 60 students.

Suitable for **Reception – Year 12.**

For 25mins at \$6.50 per student, workshops can feature one artist / instrument.

For 50 mins at \$11 per student, workshops can feature all three artists / instruments.



HANDS-ON WORKSHOP

Featuring the **Erhu or Guzheng**, Zhao Liang comes out to deliver a hands-on workshop with 4 guzhengs; or David Dai comes out to deliver a hands-on workshop with 6 erhus.

It is an opportunity for students to experience the instruments up close and personal, as well as experience music making in the pentatonic scale.

The workshops deliver **up to 60 students**, with a minimum of 35 students.

Suitable for Years 4 – 12.

For 40 mins at \$11 per student, a choice of Guzheng or Erhu can be booked.



TRAVEL AROUND THE WORLD WITH KIDS' MUSIC

San Ureshi, which means 'Joy of the Trio', is a trio consisting of **Guzheng**, **Erhu and Percussion**. Since its establishment in 2019, San Ureshi has been experimenting with various cultures, soundscapes and textures, breaking boundaries through their projects and compositions. Their music paints colourful pictures of the old and new - to be at their performance / workshop, is like being immersed in an art gallery.

Featuring children's songs with rearrangements throughout, the show has become an inter-cultural show featuring various cultures. This is very much suited to libraries, community centres and lower year levels. However, it has proven to be an all ages program.


Sally Wang (Pipa)


